Did you see the cover of the latest FORE magazine from the SCGA? The feature article on page 32 states that the familiar refrain as the week progressed was "Eddie who?" Well, to many of us who played in the APO and Tri-Org tournaments in the last 5 years know who **Eddie Heinen** is. He has been a big supporter of the tournaments since it's inception in 1997. In fact, our own **Denise Bergsrud**, **Mike Morikawa** and Mike's friend **Scott Kawasaki** played with Eddie about 3 years ago at RiverRidge in the APO Tournament. (Eddie shot 71). Eddie's brother, David Heinen (former college player at UC Santa Barbara), also played with us at

Spanish Bay, treat my wife to a nice vacation and see how things went," Eddie said. Well, in the field of 93 players, Eddie shot 79 the first day at Spanish Bay, then 74 the second day (total of 153) at Pebble Beach and waited to see if he made the cut. The 32-player (match play) cut was 153! Eddie indicated he was just happy to get what he saw as a free round at Pebble Beach. Eddie was seeded 31 and faced number 2 seed, Greg Puga, who is the 2001 U.S. Mid-Amateur champion. Eddie birdied 3 of the first 8 holes to build a 5 up lead in the front nine, and won 4 and 3.

The next opponent was Bob Niger, a frequent California Amateur competitor. Eddie birdied the 1st hole, then as Eddie put it, "Dr. Fell-A-Part showed up." He lost four straight holes, then won three in a row, then lost the 9th hole. The 10th was halved, then Niger had five consecutive 5's to fall 2 down after 13 holes. Eddie won 1 up.

Into the quarterfinals and against Matt Bettencourt the reigning Northern California Golf Association Amateur Champion and Player of the Year. In another exciting match

where only 2 holes were halved, Eddie went 2 up after three holes, only to go 1 down after the 10th. Then it got exciting, as Eddie won 11 and 12, lost 13, won 14, lost 15, and won 16 by hitting his approach shot within 6 feet of the pin. Eddie then missed a four-foot putt on 17 to win the match, but made a four-foot putt on 18 to win 1 up. Eddie later said, "I've missed half a dozen four or five footers this week. One more wasn't going to bother me."

That same day, in the semi-finals, Eddie played Buzz Peel, a quarterfinalist in last year's tournament and lives several months of the year in a suite at The Lodge at Pebble Beach. Eddie birdied four holes and shot 32 on the front nine to go 3 up after 11. But Peel pulled even on 16 when he made a 12-foot birdie putt. Eddie then won 17. This forced Peel to go for it on the famous 18th hole at Pebble Beach by cutting the dogleg. Peel pulled his tee shot slightly and watched in dismay as it landed in the ocean. After Eddie was on the green in three shots, Peel conceded the match.

The championship match of 36 holes was against Jonathan Echols, Fresno State student and another quarterfinalist in last year's

tournament. There were 11 lead changes and only four halved holes in the morning round, but Eddie came out with a 1-up lead. But Echols won the first hole of the afternoon round to pull even. Eddie took the lead on the fifth hole and never gave it up. Echols did pull even a number of times, but Eddie always responded. Brisker winds and bumpier greens made scoring more difficult in the afternoon, but Eddie said "that plays into my strength, which is my ability to control the distance on my iron shots." The match went to the last hole where both players split the fairway with their drives. Eddie's second shot landed in deep rough near a tree, while Echols was in lighter rough but also on the right. Eddie hit his approach shot safely on the green, while Echols was short on the front of the green 35 feet away. Echols missed his birdie putt and Eddie two-putted to win the Championship.

As the 91st winner of the Edward B. Tufts trophy, the name Eddie Heinen now joins such names as Ken Venturi, Gene Littler, Mark O'Meara, Johnny Miller and Bobby Clampett. Now we all know who Eddie Heinen is. And we are privileged to have his support.
